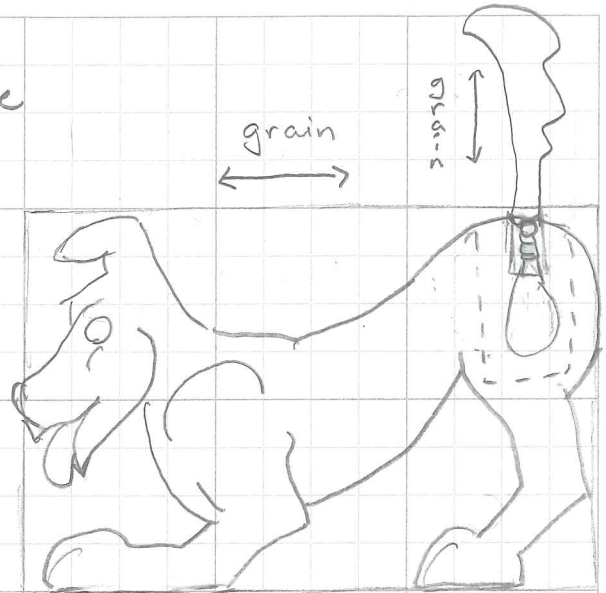

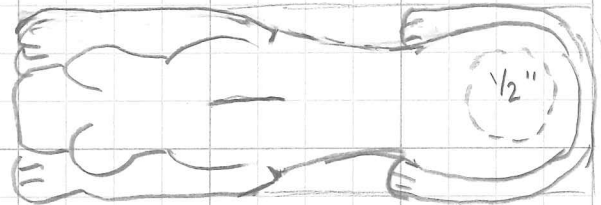
Body: Basswood 1" x 2" x 3 1/8"
 Tail: Basswood 2" long x 1/4 or 1/2" square
 Tail Weight: 1/8 oz fishing sinker
 1" of wire for an axle

Inspired by Rob Ivie's papercrafts

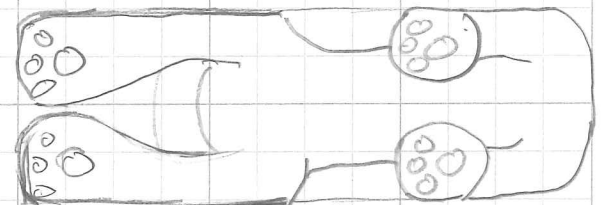
1. Start by shaping the rear end and waist 2"
2. Optional - widen the drilled hole into the waist area, to give the tail more room to swing
3. Shape the tail and attach the weight by the method of your choosing, below.
4. Thread the wire axle through the hole in the tail - ensure free movement!
5. Balance the axle on top of the tail hole to check the tail shape, center of gravity, and desired range of motion
6. Mark axle position
7. Notch opening of tail hole to hold axle.
8. Finish carving the rest of the body - ears last, separating legs last if choosing to do so



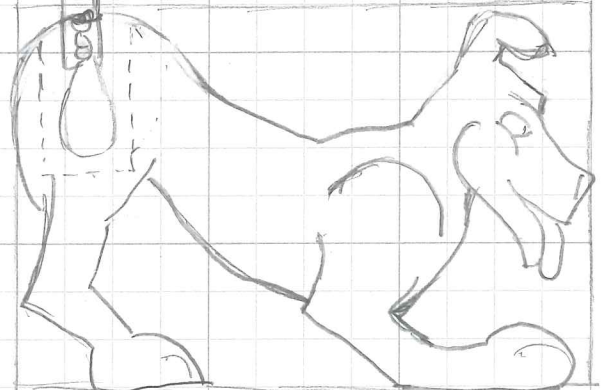
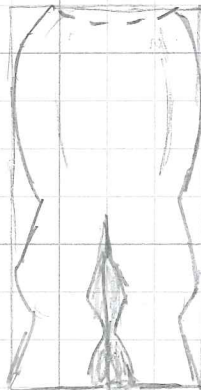

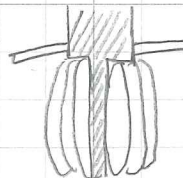


Tail options:
